

### All In God's Good Time

In God's good time, He brings about His divine plan of creation, of salvation, and of His Eternal Kingdom. I like the phrase, "In God's good time," because it carries an element of surprise, of expectation. Hopefully we have learned by now that God's time is not the same as our time. Recall the words of St. Peter in the New Testament, "But, beloved, do not forget this one thing, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day." (2Peter 3:8)

I believe it is important to remember how different God is from us, that we are part of His creation, and He is the Creator. The Prophet Isaiah wrote of this when he heard the voice of God speak, "For My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways My ways," says the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are My ways higher than your ways, and My thoughts than your thoughts." (Is.55:8-9)

Almighty God is not a part of His creation, and He exists outside of time. There was never a "time" when God did not exist. A difficult concept for the human mind to grasp, but ideal to contemplate during the Christmas season, because it was in God's good time when He sent His Son into the world.

Many prophecies predicted the place of His birth, but not the time of His birth. (And concerning our Lord's return, that time known to God alone, not even to His Son.)



For us, more than 2,000 years have passed since the birth of the Messiah, but those years for God, as St. Peter wrote, are as one day!

The Lord Jesus Christ was born in God's good time, at just the right time, for the benefit of humankind. We were not there to witness the birth, but we can read about those who did. We were not there to worship the newborn King, but we know from Holy Scripture about those who did. We were not there to watch Him grow and mature, to heal and to

preach, but thankfully, those who did were not silent!

firsthand the teachings and miracles of Christ. Fortunately, they passed on what they witnessed, so that we could remember, believe and celebrate these events each year.

May God bless us all, at this time of year, to enjoy this Christmas season, complete with family gatherings, giving and receiving gifts of love, and worshipping together on Christmas Eve in our beautiful Church together.

### Stewardship Sunday

We try to teach a consistent message each year on Christian Stewardship: we give back to God what is already His. We come into this world with nothing, and we leave it with nothing! All that we have in this life comes from God's blessings, and returning back a portion to God through His Church, is our way of acknowledging the source of our blessings.

On Sunday, December 14, we will have the annual commemoration of Stewardship Sunday, to remind ourselves of our responsibility as Stewards of everything God has blessed us with. So we consider, throughout our lives, and as an annual renewal on Stewardship Sunday, ways in which we can give back a portion of our Time, Talents and Treasures, in support of the Church.

There are no Membership Dues, there is no required minimum or maximum donation. But we should all take seriously caring for our Church, and not leaving its care to others. Our financial contributions should be a percentage of our income, whether from the government or from regular employment. This is both a fair and biblical approach to making regular offerings to our Church. It is a fair approach because percentage giving is not a fixed amount applicable to all families, and biblical because of the teaching of the tithe, or a 10% gift back to the Church.

Above all, our giving should be cheerfully given, recognizing our desire - not simply obligation - to give back to God a portion of our blessings from Him.

Being a Steward of St. Haralambos Church implies much more than membership. Our parish will continue to grow according to how each of us gives our time, talent and treasure in support of our mission to be a "loving Christcentered community whose mission is to keep, practice, and proclaim our Orthodox Christian faith as a living presence to those around us."


The ladies of Philoptochos will be having their deli/bake sale again for all of your holiday and gift-giving needs:
