Christmas on Sunday!

Christmas Day does not often fall on Sunday as it does this year. I've been asked if there will be liturgy on Christmas Day or if the Church will be closed in honor of the holiday.

The Church will be open on Christmas Day! Liturgy will begin as usual at 10 am, and Matins (Morning Prayers) will begin as usual at 8:45 am. The only Sunday of the year when liturgy is not celebrated at 10 am is Easter Sunday, since it is moved up several hours, beginning late Saturday evening.

Why not take advantage of the opportunity to celebrate Christmas on Sunday, and come early for the Matins service, which offers prayers, readings and hymns not found in the Divine Liturgy. You will hear hymns written hundreds of years ago that beautifully describe the wonder of this sacred event, including the following, taken from the perspective of Mary, the Theotokos:

Mary, why do you wonder? Why are you inwardly astonished? She replied, "For within the limits of time, I have given birth to a Son who is beyond time. I do not comprehend the conception of Him whom I bore. I have known no man, how could I bear a Son? Who ever beheld a seedless birth?" As it is written, where God wills, the laws of nature are overcome. Christ was born of the Virgin in Bethlehem of Judea.

Many hymns like this are written to remind us of the mystery of the birth of Christ, which is a central theme in the Orthodox Christian tradition. They may not be as well-known, yet they speak to the heart of the Christmas celebration, and help us from focusing only on the commercial and materialistic emphasis so popular today.

One of the hymns from Matins, which has also found its way into the Divine Liturgy, is the Magnificat, which describes our Lord's mysterious and humble birth:

I behold a strange and marvelous mystery. The cave is Heaven; the Virgin, a Cherubic Throne; the manger, a room in which Christ our God, who is boundless, was placed, whom we magnify in praise.

the week we dedicate to praise and worship of Christ the Savior. Hopefully with Christmas falling on Sunday this year, the connection with Christ, Christmas and the Church will be even more apparent.
