

More Blessed to Give than to Receive

At his retirement dinner, a priest offered these words: "I've spent time with perhaps hundreds of people who have been hospitalized for various reasons. I've prayed with them and heard their confessions. You know the one thing I've never heard any of them say? "I wish I hadn't given so much away; I wish I had kept more for myself."

Many people have offered various opinions on what is the key to true happiness. Let's recall the words of St. Augustine (354 - 430AD), who wrote, "Where your pleasure is, there is your treasure; where your treasure is, there is your heart; where your heart is, there is your happiness." He was reflecting on the words of our Lord from the Sermon on the Mount, "for where your treasure is, there is your heart also." (Matt.6:21)

But why do you think St. Augustine's comments also mention pleasure and happiness? Perhaps because he understands the connection between being a happy person and a giving person; a connection that is pleasing to God, as St. Paul wrote about in 2nd Corinthians: "Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

Coming now to the end of 2019 and the beginning of 2020, we are asking parishioners to renew their stewardship of St. Haralambos Church, committing a portion of their time, talents and treasure, not just in support of the Church, but in recognition that all that a person has comes from God, and it is a good thing to use those gifts properly in ways that are pleasing to God and continue to build up His Holy Church.

Some would propose a solution to request that all parishioners increase their annual giving by a certain dollar amount. This solution may seem equitable, but would really put an unfair financial burden on those who are already contributing a significant portion of their income. And this gets to the heart of the most traditional – and fair – concept of giving to the Church: percentage giving.

Starting in the Old Testament with a 10-percent tithe to the temple, this teaching is that by offering a percent of God's blessings back to His church, each family will

not be offering an equal amount, but each will be making an equal sacrifice. So when considering how much to give in support of the church, begin by thinking in terms of percentage giving, rather than a specific dollar amount.

There are no church membership dues or fees that all parishioners are expected to contribute.

Every family in our parish should also consider how they can contribute to parish ministries. Do you have the call to serve our young people, to visit or offer assistance to the sick or shut-ins, help with liturgical needs such as singing or reading, prepare the offering bread (prosfora), memorial wheat (koliva) or church flowers, greet new members, help teach current members, assist with building maintenance, or offer to begin a new ministry? How is God calling you to serve in your church? Your response to this call is the foundation of Christian stewardship.

In summarizing the meaning and purpose of the Church, Metropolitan Maximos of Pittsburgh wrote, "The Church is the great sacrament of salvation that Christ has instituted in the world. It is the Ark of Salvation, and the inaugurated Kingdom of God... The Church thus conceived is not just another human

Special General Assembly

On Sunday the Nov. 3, the fall General Assembly was held in part to review and approve the 2020 Parish budget. The proposed budget was not accepted, and a motion to amend the budget was made to review, adjust errors that were identified, and include an increase in the priest's compensation. The compensation adjustment is to bring it up to the minimal recommended amount by the Archdiocese Clergy Compensation Guidelines.

The Parish Council is now in the process of revising the budget, and has scheduled a Special General Assembly for Dec. 15 for the purpose of presenting and requesting approval of the amended 2020 Parish budget.

The Parish Council will send out the revised budget (with above-mentioned revisions) on Dec. 5 via email. This will allow time for parishioners to review the adjusted budget prior to the scheduled


