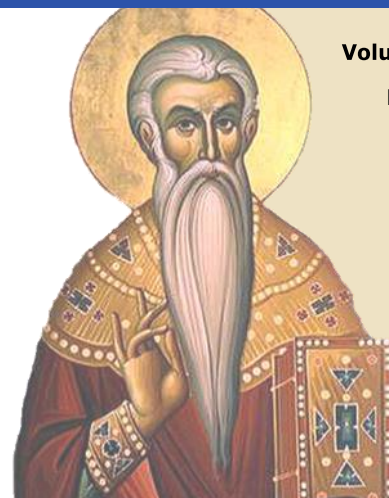

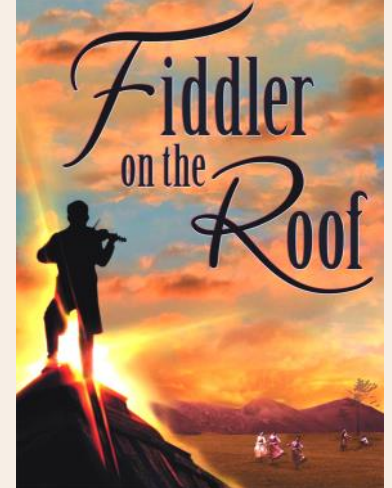

Also on Sunday, Feb. 21 at 5 pm, there will be an "Arizona Premiere" of a narrative film that explores the power of prayer. Please, Lord, grant me patience; NOW!

In a memorable scene from the movie, “A League of their Own,” the story of the first women’s professional baseball league, coach Jimmy Dugan (played by Tom Hanks) signals a player that he needs to have a word with her about a simple play she missed during the previous inning. Using only his hands and a variety of extremely tense facial expressions, he doesn’t say a word. You can almost see the fumes escaping from his ears; the player is expecting a verbal explosion any second. But then, remarkably, coach slowly forms a forced smile, and with fingers still shaking, slowly and calmly asks his outfielder to try and work on improving her fundamentals before next season. The confrontation now over, the player slowly exhales, smiles and replies that she’ll do better next time. Coach Dugan takes a few more seconds to regain his composure, and turned what could have been a regrettable verbal tirade into an impressive coachable moment.

That patience is a virtue, no one can deny. From children who demand more play time, to adults who have to put up with a slow internet connection, we understand the daily need for patience. We appreciate it when others are patient with us, yet too often do not return the favor. Whether by ourselves (driving in traffic, waiting in line or “on hold”) or with others (miscommunication, not doing things my (the right) way, or getting the family ready to leave on-time), we can be very quick to justify the loss of patience as inevitable.

This month we are preparing for our annual Festival, the largest event of the year for Saint Haralambos Church. We are asking for everyone’s help with the baking, set-up, booth shifts and eventual tear-down and storage for next year. This

month, then, is the most appropriate month for us to focus on patience. We’re interacting with each other more often, and under more stressful conditions, than at any other time of the year.

You’ve heard the various remedies for exercising patience: Holding our tongue (a figure of speech), counting to ten, walking away, and splashing cold water on our face. Some of them may work, but because they treat the symptoms and not the cause, are only temporary fixes.

The foundation of patience is love, treating others as we would like to be treated. Remember that the person working next to you is your brother or sister, a member of our Church family, like you. They, like you, are not perfect. They, like you, get tired. They, like you, have other things on their minds. They, like you, are trying to do the best they can.

When someone is not doing a task exactly as you directed, see them first as yourself, a human being, and give them the respect due a brother or sister in the Lord. Using a calm voice, call them by their name and no other, and offer your help whether it’s another explanation, a helping hand or doing the task together. Helping them with their task is helping you, is helping the Festival, is helping our Church.

If you find yourself on the receiving end of someone offering help, do so graciously and humbly, rather than feeling too proud to accept a helping hand. It is rude to refuse a gift of love. If a sincere offer of help is coming your way, why would you refuse to accept it? (Continued next month)

The Heritage Greece Program will run from June 9 to 26, 2016.

ACG is accepting applications through Mar. 25. We are seeking Greek-American college students who have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher and have never or seldom been to Greece.

Vasilopita Sunday was a huge success! Thank you to all who baked and helped with this event. Our sales totaled over \$500 and will go to support St. Basil's Academy which offers safe haven, home and services for Orthodox children.

dedication and generosity our festival would not be possible. We look forward to a successful and fun festival.

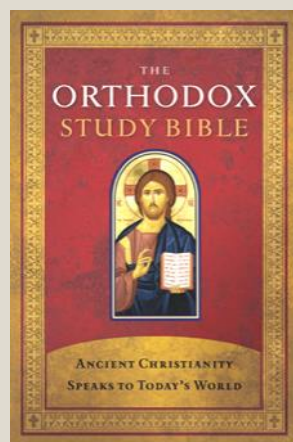


Orthodox Study Group

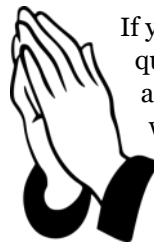

job hosting the coffee hour.

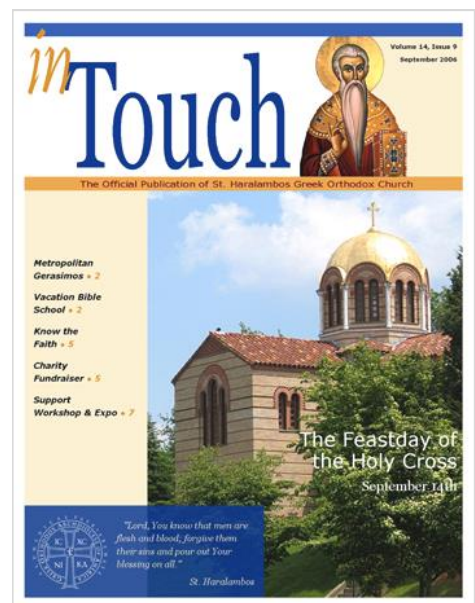
