Yes, I'm biased, but it's a bias that comes with lots of experience, having tasted Greek food at many restaurants, Greek festivals and Greek islands!

The difficult part about hosting, of course, is that we're not able to enjoy the festival as we do when visiting other festivals. It's very nice to welcome visitors and watch as they enjoy the fruits of our labors, but it's also pretty tiring. But that's the job of the host!

Also on Sunday, Mar. 1, we will be having our parish Oratorical Festival following the Divine Liturgy. This program is an opportunity for our young people to write and deliver speeches (and


