We Gather Together to Ask the Lord's Blessings

The month of November has two religious celebrations, one found in the bible, and the other found in our nation's history. The first, the feastday of the Presentation of the Theotokos in the Temple, is celebrated each year on the 21st of November, commemorating that moment when, as a young child, the blessed Theotokos was brought to the temple by her parents, Joachim and Anna.

This was to fulfill a promise they made to God in thanksgiving for her birth. Joachim and Anna were unable to conceive children, yet were both told by angels of God that their prayers were heard, and that they would be soon become parents. When Mary was three years old, she was brought to the temple to be consecrated to God.

Celebrated shortly after this feastday, we come to the American religious holiday of Thanksgiving celebrated each year on the fourth Thursday in November.

Having lost nearly half of their group the first year to the harshness of winter and lack of food, the pilgrims set aside a day of feasting and prayer in thanks to Almighty God the following year for having survived with the help of native American Indians.

November is the Thanksgiving month within the Church and in American society; a wonderful time for us to count our blessings, and to be thankful for all that God has given to us.

What is one very practical and helpful way to thank God for our blessings? To think about sharing with others, to help others with needs greater than our own may not be the first thought that comes to mind, but is a wonderful way to let God know that we are thankful, enough so that we pass that love on to others.

That does require a bit of humility, doesn't it? In our minds, we know that there are countless number of people – men, women and children – who are in need of basic comforts such as food and shelter. It is something else, though, to act on what we know; to put knowledge and prayer into action. But this is the Christian response to God's love – passing it along. It's also such a wonderful way to thank God – to pass it along!

If someone gave you a gift, and you enjoy it so much you just have to share it with someone else, you not only bring happiness to a third person, you honor the friend who gave you the gift in the first place. A very moving example is recorded in the 3rd chapter of the New Testament Book of Acts (Acts 3:1-8) involving the apostles Peter and John:

"Now Peter and John went up together to the temple at the hour of prayer, the ninth hour. And a certain man lame from his mother's womb was carried, whom they laid daily at the gate of the temple which is called Beautiful, to ask alms from those who entered the temple; who, seeing Peter and John about to go into the temple, asked for alms. And fixing his eyes on him, with John, Peter said, "Look at us." So he gave them his attention, expecting to receive something from them.

Then Peter said, "Silver and gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk." And he took him by the right hand and lifted him up, and immediately his feet and ankle bones received strength. So he,

leaping up, stood and walked and entered the temple with them walking, leaping, and praising God."

Give from what you have! Are you thankful to God for his blessings, his great mercy and love? Pass it along; give to others out of love, expecting nothing back. You bring joy to another human being, and you are saying 'thank you' to God by extending that love to others.

Not everyone has the gift of leadership. But when leadership is looked at in terms of service, perhaps more would be willing to respond to this special call of parish leadership.

There are many opportunities to serve in the Church, one of which is serving on the Parish Council. The Parish Council, together with the Parish Priest, has the authority and responsibility to administer the parish, in accordance with the Archdiocese Uniform Parish Regulations, the parish by-laws, along with the Mission and Vision of St. Haralambos Church.

Service on the Parish Council does carry responsibility, but it is shared among all the members. The Saint Haralambos Parish Council has nine seats, each with a two-year term of office. Council members meet at least once each month to discuss current and future administrative needs of our Church.

Parish Council elections are in December each year, this year on Sunday, Dec. 11. Nominations for candidates are accepted at the Fall General Assembly, this year on Sunday, Nov. 20. (nomination form can be found on page 8) All eligible candidates must attend a Parish Council Seminar led by Fr. Michael on Thursday, Dec. 1 at 7 pm.

If you have the desire to serve our parish in this capacity, fill out the Nomination Form and either send to the church office, or give it to Jean Baxter, Nominations Committee Chair, during Sunday Coffee Hour.



Position Description: Building Manager

POSITION SUMMARY: Reporting to the Parish Council, the Building Manager has overall responsibility for managing all building operations through hands-on leadership and delegation of assignments and projects. Responsible for maintenance, cleaning, and upkeep of the building to include sanctuary, common areas, classrooms, kitchen, Fellowship Room and lavatories. Responsible for monitoring and performing routine inspections of all areas and various systems within the building (in accordance with short and long-term maintenance schedules). Develops and promotes good working relationships with other parish leadership and community.

TYPICAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Oversees the overall cleanliness and maintenance of the facility and equipment, maintaining a high standard of safety and efficiency.
- Inspects building and equipment to ascertain required maintenance and repairs, (in accordance with short and long-term maintenance schedules).

- Manages all phases of building maintenance, determines required resources and develops project teams.
- 4. Monitors the work of contracted cleaning services; addresses concerns as necessary.
- 5. Establishes a maintenance request intake process and prioritizes work orders as needed
- 6. Assists in energy management strategies
- Maintains a working knowledge of facility operations including electrical, water, (exterior surfaces: paint, stucco, etc.), controls and heating and ventilation/ AC (HVAC), systems and related equipment.
- 8. Assists all emergency operations
- Responsible for set up of building facilities related to Divine services, classrooms, organizational meetings, special events.
- Prepares and submits Building Maintenance budget requests to Parish Council in August each year.

Position Description: Grounds Manager

POSITION SUMMARY: Reporting to the Parish Council, the Grounds Manager has overall responsibility for managing Parish grounds through hands-on leadership and delegation of assignments and projects. Responsible for maintenance, cleaning, and upkeep of Parish grounds to include exterior of the building, parking lot, driveways and walkways, playground and fields. Responsible for monitoring and performing routine inspections of all areas and various systems external of the building. Develops and promotes good working relationships with other parish leadership and community.

TYPICAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Oversees the overall cleanliness and maintenance of parish grounds and related equipment including irrigation and landscaping, maintaining a high standard of safety and efficiency.
- Inspects building and grounds to ascertain required maintenance and repairs, in accordance with short and long-term maintenance schedules.

- 3. Manages all phases of external grounds maintenance, determines required resources and develops project teams.
- 4. Monitors the work of contracted landscapers and other workers; addresses concerns as necessary, and in accordance with short and long-term maintenance schedules.
- 5. Establishes a maintenance request intake process and prioritizes work orders as needed
- Assists in water management strategies
- Maintains a working knowledge of grounds-keeping operations including electrical, landscaping, irrigation controls and related equipment.
- 8. Assists all emergency operations
- Responsible for set up of grounds related to special events.
- 10. Prepares and submits Grounds-keeping Maintenance budget requests to Parish Council in August each year.

Position Description: Kitchen Manager

POSITION SUMMARY: Reporting to the Parish Council, the Kitchen Manager has overall responsibility for managing all kitchen operations through hands-on leadership and delegation of assignments and projects. Responsible for maintenance, cleaning, and upkeep of the kitchen. Responsible for monitoring and performing routine inspections. Develops and promotes good working relationships with other parish leadership and community.

TYPICAL RESPONSIBILITIES


- 1. Oversees the overall cleanliness and maintenance of the Kitchen maintaining a high standard of safety, sanitation, and efficiency.
- 2. Inspects kitchen equipment to ascertain required maintenance and repairs, working together with weekly cleaning company.
- Establishes weekly cleaning protocols, monthly cleaning schedule, and assigns deep cleaning tasks, working together with weekly cleaning company.

- 4. Manages all related inventory and determines storage requirements, ensures rotation procedures are followed and overstocking is not occurring.
- Provides oversight in the preparation and coordinates serving of food, complying with all applicable health department requirements.
- Oversight of cleanliness and storage of equipment and proper storage of food, maintaining good housekeeping practices in all areas of the kitchen.
- 7. Establishes check out protocols for kitchen equipment used in festival preparations.
- 8. Checks all freezers and refrigerators, maintaining proper settings.
- 9. Oversight of kitchen supplies and equipment that may be stored outside of kitchen.
- 10. Prepares and submits Kitchen Maintenance budget requests to Parish Council in August each year.


