Church Interior Design Project

Part of the future plans of our parish include the construction of a new church, a Byzantine-style temple that was designed under the direction of Callahan Studios, and we all hope to see that dream become reality. Until we are able to begin construction, we will continue holding services in our current worship space, which, although accommodating, looks nothing like the interior of a traditional Orthodox Church temple.

That's about to change.

Last month the Parish Council approved plans to beautify the interior of our Church, including the Narthex, Nave and Altar. The project, which has been in the design phase for the past several months, will include the addition of traditional liturgical colors that will, for as long as we use **this current space, help give it more of an "Orthodox" look.**

Once the base color paints have been applied, decorative borders will be painted around the icons on the walls. The large icons on the iconostasion will be framed and securely hung, as well as additional decorative borders and new vigil lights. Paint color and style of design will be consistent from the church entrance, throughout the interior and into the altar.

St. Nicholas National Shrine at Ground Zero

The only house of worship to be destroyed on September 11, 2001, was St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church at Ground Zero in New York. Since that time, our Archdiocese has been negotiating the re-building of this historic church into a national shrine.

The Ground-blessing ceremony is scheduled for Saturday, Oct. 18. Here is an article from the St. Nicholas National Shrine at Ground Zero website regarding the plans to rebuild.

In a recent New York Times article (Nov. 20, 2013), David Dunlap wrote about the elevated park above Liberty Street in the rebuilt World Trade Center site. "that will command a panoramic view of the National September 11 Memorial." This "Liberty Park" will create "...a landscaped forecourt for the new St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church; to provide a gathering space for as many as 750 people at a time; to allow visitors to contemplate the whole memorial in a single sweeping glance from treetop level..."

It should not difficult for anyone to see that Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church at Ground Zero, a National Shrine of our Archdiocese.

will truly be, as the Lord preached in the Sermon on the Mount, "the city set on a hill that cannot be hidden" (Matthew 5:14).

The "city set on a hill" or the "high city" is in fact an "acropolis," a word that speaks volumes not only to Greek Orthodox Christians everywhere, but to most people in the Western World. But the Greek word, AKPOΣ, actually means "highest," "topmost," "utmost," and even "consummate." So an "acropolis" is always the citadel set on the highest point of any city, and throughout the ancient world, numerous examples can be found, even if only in ruins.


Now the resurrected Saint Nicholas is not located on the earthly highest point of New York City. However, it is certainly set on the sublime spiritual summit that witnessed the horror and the heroism of that pivotal day we know as 9/11. The elevated physical position of the church structure has tremendous implications for the mission and relevancy of the Shrine to New York City and to the world. Literally millions of visitors to the Memorial and Museum will pass by Saint Nicholas Shrine year after year. The opportunities for witness

to the transcendent human values of the Orthodox Christian Faith are as many as those millions of pilgrims who will come to Ground Zero to remember and to pray.

The new Saint Nicholas, like the Parthenon that graces the Acropolis, has the potential to inspire these millions. Many will enter the Shrine and light a candle. Some will kneel to pray and venerate the icons. Some will make it a point to make it their house of worship. Others will sit quietly and meditate. Still others will go to the bereavement space on the second floor to find solace in their own tradition.

Book Presentation by Author Judith Starkston

Everyone is invited on Monday, Oct. 6 at 7 p.m., to hear a presentation by author Judith Starkston discuss her recently published historical fiction novel, Hand of Fire, based on the Trojan War. Ms. Starkston will speak about what inspired her to bring to life the story of a forgotten captive woman, Briseis, of the legendary Trojan War. She will also discuss her travels and research which provided the background for her story. A question and answer period will follow. After the presentation, we will be conducting our monthly Philoptochos meeting.

Here is a review of Hand of Fire from the Historical Novels Review: "In Hand of Fire, Judith Starkston frees Briseis from the actions of Achilles and Agamemnon and gives her the power to become the heroine of her own story. ... Starkston does a lovely job of bringing the characters to life, and her descriptions of the religious rites, the scenery of Mount Ida, and life as a woman of privilege in the ancient world put me firmly in the story. The love story between Briseis and Achilles is well-rendered, as are Briseis' relationships with her father and brothers, her nurse, and the other women in the city and in the camp. A wonderful new take on a timeless story."
