Feast of the Holy Cross

"For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." (1Cor.1:18)

The first major Feastday of the New Church Year is celebrated on the 14th of September, the Exaltation of the Precious and Life-giving Cross. This holy day commemorates the finding of the cross upon which our Lord Jesus Christ was crucified by Saint Helen, mother of Saint Constantine. It was a miraculous journey and discovery, and is worth re-printing here. (source: GOARCH.org)

Saint Helen, the mother of Saint Constantine the Great, when she was already advanced in years, undertook, in her great piety, the hardships of a journey to Jerusalem in search of the cross, about the year 325. A temple to Aphrodite had been raised up by the Emperor Hadrian upon Golgotha, to defile and cover with oblivion the place where the saving Passion had been suffered.

The venerable Helen had the statue of Aphrodite destroyed, and the earth removed, revealing the Tomb of our Lord, and three crosses. Of these, it was believed that one must be that of our Lord, the other two of the thieves crucified with Him; but Saint Helen was at a loss which one might be the Wood of our salvation.

At the inspiration of Saint Macarius, Archbishop of Jerusalem, a lady of Jerusalem, who was already at the point of death from a certain disease, was brought to touch the crosses, and as soon as she came near to the Cross of our Lord, she was made perfectly whole.

Consequently, the precious Cross was lifted on high by Archbishop Macarius of Jerusalem; as he stood on the ambo, and when the people beheld it, they cried out, "Lord have mercy." It should be noted that after its discovery, a portion of the venerable Cross was taken to Constantinople as a blessing. The rest was left in Jerusalem in the magnificent church built by Saint Helen, until the year 614. At that time, the Persians plundered Palestine and took the Cross to their own country. Later, in the year 628, Emperor Heraclius set out on a military campaign, retrieved the Cross, and after bringing it to Constantinople, himself escorted it back to Jerusalem, where he restored it to its place.

Orthodox churches all over the world commemorate this great feast with a special procession of the cross, decorated with basil, the herb growing above the place where the cross was found. The slow processional Trisagion hymn is chanted together with the other hymns of the feast: "O Lord, save

Your people and bless Your inheritance, granting Your rulers to prevail over adversaries; and protecting Your commonwealth by Your Cross."

In the Matins service we read the following prayer each Sunday, "You were lifted up upon the cross of your own will, Christ our God. Grant your mercy upon the people that bear your name. In your strength make glad the Orthodox, giving them victory over their adversaries. May they have your alliance as a weapon of peace, and an in-vincible trophy."

We are reminded of the great spiritual battle we all face as followers of the Christian life. Taking up the appropriate weapons gives us spiritual strength – the cross as a "weapon of peace" being a prime example.

Divine Liturgy for the feast of the Holy Cross will be celebrated Wednesday morning, Sep. 14 at 9 am.

Please come help build a roof over the storage space in the east parking lot. Lunch will be served.


