

Protecting Our World

It begins with God's instruction to Adam and Eve written in the Old Testament Book of Genesis. After creating Adam and Eve, the first human beings, "Then God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth." (Gen. 1:28)

Here we have the first recorded blessing from God, after which He commands Adam and Eve to be good stewards of His creation. By subduing the earth and having dominion over it, Adam and Eve are given the responsibility of taking care of the Garden of Eden. What a gift! And what responsibility!

Unfortunately, there are some who have twisted the meaning of God's words to suggest that creation needs nothing from man, since it's ours to dominate in ways that pollute, corrupt and destroy. What a waste, and terrible misunderstanding of God's creation and our responsibility to care for it.

Although we've seen incredible ways that nature has its own miraculous ability to heal itself following oil spills and wildfires, for example - mankind still has ultimate responsibility to look after and protect our planet.

The Orthodox Church has maintained the proper respect and understanding of man's role in caring for God's creation, even while our own generation has seen unprecedented destruction and pollution of land, air and waterways. Ecumenical Patriarch Demetrios, of blessed memory (+1991), felt a particular calling to raise awareness of this issue.

In an encyclical from September 1, 1989, he wrote, "Unfortunately, in our days under the influence of an extreme rationalism and selfcenteredness, humanity has lost the sense of sacredness of creation and acts as its arbitrary ruler and rude violator. Instead of the Eucharistic and ascetic spirit with which the Orthodox Church brought up its children for centuries, we observe today a violation of nature for the satisfaction, not of basic human

needs, but of man's endless and constantly increasing desire and lust, encouraged by the prevailing philosophy of the consumer society."

He goes on to establish a new feastday for the Orthodox Church calendar.

"Accordingly, we declare the first day of September of each year a

day on which, on the feast of the Indiction, namely the first day of the ecclesiastical year, prayers and supplications are to be offered in this holy center of Orthodoxy for all

creation, declaring this day to be the day of the protection of the environment."

If we continue to enjoy being out in nature that is unspoiled, we must accept the responsibility to see that our children can enjoy the same. We must teach them that God's gift of our planet is ours to enjoy as well as to care for.

Budgets and the GOOD News?

Last month I shared with you a subject that might be alien to many of us; the reality of our Parish Budget. And, as I shared, at midyear we were faced with a deficit of \$34,000, largely as a result of a decline in income.

Unlike the Federal Government, we here at St. Haralambos do not have the option of sustained deficit spending. At some point income and expenses need to be brought into alignment.

There are two ways to bring deficit spending under control; 1) Control Expenses, and 2) Raise Income. And there are two ways to raise income; 1) more fundraisers, and 2) increased giving.

As I reported to you last month we saw operating expenses remain flat for the first 6 months of 2013 at \$142,380 nearly matching the total for the first 6 months of 2012, at \$142,790.

The good news is that income seems to have picked up! I am happy to report that we have received over \$6,000 in specified gifts towards maintenance of our parking areas. This work will be scheduled soon after our Taste of Greece Festival.

Also, when a few weeks ago we made you aware of our difficult cash position, many of you responded with contributions towards reduction of our deficit. A summary report will be coming soon.

Near Term Fundraising

In terms of fundraising, we look forward to another successful yard sale on October 4th and 5th. Parting with those items cluttering your garage will go a long way towards ensuring its success! Please bring your gently used items to the Church beginning Sept. 8.

We also anticipate that later in October, we will be blessed with another successful Taste of Greece Festival, and that we will see a boost in festival income. The planning committee has been working on some exciting new ideas for 2013 such as pre-ordered frozen ready to bake takehome, adding another way for us to enjoy that Taste of Greece!

Looking forward...

Longer term, for us to begin building that Byzantine sanctuary we envision, we need to get to a point where Stewardship giving provides for 100% of our operating expenses, and the Festival and other fundraising efforts are wholly directed towards our Building Fund. Again, there are two ways to get there; 1) Grow the number of pledged Stewards, and 2) increased giving.

What might that look like?

Based on our 2013 Budgeted Expenses of \$287,700, less the \$52,000 income we receive from the sale of our old building and rental of the cell tower, we would need to receive \$235,000 from stewardship. Assuming 150 pledged Stewards, the average gift returned to God would be \$1,566 or about double today's average of \$729. Assuming 200 pledged Stewards, the average gift would rise to \$1,175.

At our upcoming Fall 2013 General Assembly, we will review and approve our Parish's 2014 operating budget. However, unlike years past when passing a budget was simply an agenda item and formality, we will prayerfully consider our spending plan in light of our parish vision statement which is: "We are a loving Christ-centered community whose mission is to keep practice and proclaim our Orthodox Christian faith as a living presence to those around us."

<u>For They Shall See God</u> by author David Beck

Is it possible to see God in the present? This is the profound question that author David Beck addresses.


The Lord said to Moses, "You cannot see my face; for man shall not see me and live" (Ex. 33:20), but "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God" (Matt. 5:8) promises the Lord Jesus to the crowds. Exploring the meaning of these two seemingly opposing scriptural texts, Beck guides us to the reality of a 'Transformed Vision'.... Using sacred scripture, the writings of the Holy Fathers and the Saints, along with writings of Christian authors of our own day, Beck walks us through the refreshing statements of faith and the experiences of those who have, 'crossed over from the flesh to the spirit."

For They Shall See God reminds us that God is everywhere; we see God in nature, in ourselves and in others. But to have this ability or vision, we must achieve purity of heart and this path to purity is dependent on following a church life.

Beck writes that the path to purity is the "heart of the church, found in the services and practices throughout the year." The three key practices are fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. These practices build self-restraint and discipline. These are also the tools we need in our fight with spiritual warfare.

The author goes on to warn that we can do all the right things to achieve purity of heart but for the wrong reasons....that often our desire to be pure in heart "has its roots in the need to be noticed and respected by others." Striving for transcendent contentment is necessary to truly know God's grace. This contentment means believing that everything that happens to us is allowed by our Father. When we surrender to His holy Will we live in the present and are then able to find God within us and all who we encounter. Beck quotes Fr. Anthony Coniaris who preached, "Practice the idea that God is with you, in you, and about you. Practice it until you feel His presence. It is by practicing the Presence that the Presence becomes real."

Uplifting and easy to read this book will revive your spirit and truly quench your thirst to "see God."
