

#### The Baptism of Our Lord

On the 12th day of Christmas, January 6, the Orthodox Christian Church celebrates the feastday of Epiphany, the baptism of our Lord, Jesus Christ. One of the 12 major feasts days of the Orthodox Church calendar, the feastday services begin with the reading of the Royal Hours, which will take place at 9 am on Friday, Jan. 5. Later that afternoon, at 4 pm, we will celebrate the Divine Liturgy of St. Basil, and conclude with the Great

Blessing of the Waters. During this service, the Holy Water font is blessed and we fill bottles of Holy Water for everyone. Finally, on the morning of Saturday, Jan. 6, the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom will be celebrated at 9 am, and again followed by the Great Blessing of the Waters.

Recorded in the gospels of St. Matthew, Mark and Luke, Jesus comes to John at the River Jordan to be baptized. John had already begun baptizing crowds of people

from Jerusalem, Judea and the region all around the Jordan; but when he sees Jesus, he suddenly stops, being aware of the One approaching.

"Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan to be baptized by him. And John tried to prevent Him, saying, "I need to be baptized by You, and are You coming to me?" But Jesus answered and said to him, "Permit it to be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." Then he allowed Him." (Matt. 3:13-15)

In confirmation of John's awareness, as Jesus is baptized the heavens opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon Jesus in the form of a dove, and the voice of God the Father was heard, saying, *"This is my beloved Son, in Whom I am well pleased."* (Matt. 3:17)

What an awesome scene! What an awesome moment! More than the baptism of Jesus, this miraculous event is known today as Epiphany (Revelation) or Theophany (Revelation of God)





among Christian churches. God in Trinity is revealed at the Lord's baptism, after which the Jesus begins His 3-year adult ministry.

One of seven sacraments in the Orthodox Christian tradition,

Baptism as the first sacrament in a person's life, mystically grafts the candidate into the Body of Christ, the Church. In Orthodox sacrament of Chrisma

Church. In Orthodox practice, the sacrament of Chrismation, the reception of the Holy Spirit, is

given immediately after Baptism, as this follows the earliest Church practice. Then, as a full member of the Christian faith, the newly baptized receives the Sacrament of Holy Communion, the third of three sacraments offered to the newly baptized.

Sacraments in the Orthodox Church are best described as the "Invisible Grace of God, given through visible means." No visible changes are seen after someone is baptized, receives the Holy Spirit and the Sacrament of Holy Communion. The "visible means" to convey these spiritual blessings

#### Parish Council News

Greetings to all! I hope everyone had a blessed Christmas and the Lord was rewarding to all. If you missed the General Assembly and would like to view the slides from my presentation <u>click here</u> or contact the church office for a copy. We discussed at the parish council meeting to entertaining an offer from an investment company, for the sale of the cell phone tower lease. They have offered us \$295,000 with the terms reflecting the original lease. We have 10 years on the current lease with ATT at \$1300 a month.

We would take \$250,000, invest it for a return of 5-6% which would be around \$1100 per month. The \$250,000 is still in our possession. We had attorneys look at both the offer letter and the contract. The language in the original lease cannot be changed. Rest assured we will act in the church's' best interest.

Keep in mind the money is imperative to the life of the church. We are facing a significant deficit of over \$17,000 for 2024 with a budget of \$379,000. All the money we have comes from the daycare, the mortgage from the Coptic church, and stewardship.

We beautified the church and identified our Orthodox faith with the portico. The federal grant has provided us with improvements that would be otherwise out of our financial reach. We will have a special assembly to authorize the sale of the lease. Also keep in mind the equipment on the land is still OURS. What also weighed in on the decision to sell the tower lease was the cost(ours) to remove it from the property when the lease expires in 10 years, it would cost the church \$300,00 to remove it from the property.

The council is using good business sense in advocating for the sale of the lease. If the congregation objects, then we will need suggestions moving forward how to remedy the IMMEDIATE financial needs. Thank God for Cynthia and Mary Undiano for juggling all the bills and keeping us in good standing with our finances.

The silver lining to the negative diatribe of mine is St.Haralambos Greek Orthodox church is OURS, and the only Greek Orthodox church in the west valley.

We have a special community that offers love and warmth. I believe the Lord has provided for us with the opportunity to sell the lease and make us whole for HIS house.

Now let's look to stewardship to help balance the budget. You can measure your giving using the chart in the bulletin, whether it be 5, 8 or 10 %. Its important no matter what you pledge so our church can keep moving forward.

(Luke16: 1-9) Jesus made it clear that we are all stewards of all he has given us. We manage his resources on earth. The point of stewardship is that we manage what God owns (and he owns everything) He wants the maximum return on his investment. Managers of his house, work hard and smart. They look for the "extra" opportunity to serve God well.

The parish council are the managers, we take an oath to fulfill his needs and desires.

Everyone have a blessed new year with happiness and health!

Healing, received as needed for spiritual and physical healing; Holy Matrimony, required for all who are married in the Orthodox Church, and Holy Orders, required for those who desire to serve the Church as members of the clergy.

Let us keep in mind the gifts of the sacraments in the Orthodox Church, as means of receiving God's loving grace for the benefit of our souls and bodies.


#### Stewardship

The 2024 Stewardship brochures have been mailed to all parish families. Additional brochures are available in the Narthex and the church office. Please print legibly, and enter your contributions of time, talents and treasure. Completed brochures can be mailed to the office or dropped off on Sundays.

There are no Membership Dues in the Orthodox Church, there is no required minimum or maximum for offerings. Our offerings show our care for the continued functioning of our Church. It is not appropriate to leave this care to others, or to give our offerings only from games of chance such as lotteries or gambling.

The teaching on Christian Stewardship remains consistent to help us learn to be good stewards: we give back to God what is already His. We come into this world with nothing, and we leave it with nothing. All that we have in this life comes from God's blessings, and returning back a portion to God through His Church, is our way of acknowledging the source of our blessings. Our financial contributions should be a percentage of our financial resources. This continues the biblical teaching on deciding an appropriate amount each year. It is fair because percentage giving is not a fixed amount applicable to all families, and it is biblical because of the teaching of the tithe, or a 10% gift back to the Church. Above all, our giving should be cheerfully given, recognizing our desire - not simply obligation - to give back to God a portion of our blessings we receive from Him.

Being a Steward of St. Haralambos Church implies much more than membership. Our parish will continue to grow according to how each of us gives our time, talent and treasure in support of our mission to be a "loving Christ-centered community whose mission is to keep, practice, and proclaim our Orthodox Christian faith as a living presence to those around us."
