

#### **Oratorical Festival**

The St. John Chrysostom Oratorical Festival has provided Ethiopian eunuch who saved the prophet Jeremiah. To Greek Orthodox teens, grades seven to twelve the opportunity to write and speak about their faith for over forty years.

Two teen members of Saint Haralambos participated in the festival this year on both the parish and district levels. The parish festival was held Mar. 23. Nile Solomon and Adonna Moges represented the parish senior division at the Southwest District festival on March 30 at Holy Trinity Cathedral in Phoenix. Only two participants from each division progress to the Metropolis level, and this year both girls will be representing Saint Haralambos and the district, and advancing to the Metropolis level.

Nile chose the topic asking that she choose a lesser known figure from the Bible, and explain who they are, how they fit into the Biblical narrative and what we can learn from them. She chose Ebed-Melech, a brave and clever

#### Christ's Holy Resurrection

"Come, receive the Light, from the Unwaning Light, and glorify Christ, Who is risen from the dead!"

The excitement is building, as it does every year at this time, approaching the end of our Lenten Journey. The hymn text above, sung only at one evening service each year, in the midst of a darkened Church, when our attention is drawn to a single vigil candle which rests on the Holy Altar table. Celebrated on Holy Saturday evening in Orthodox Churches throughout the world, the priest is the first to receive this flame from which he lights the paschal candle, then moves out from the altar and shares this light of Christ's Resurrection with the faithful in attendance.

The hymn is repeated by all as the Church interior begins to glow brighter as more and more rows of candles are lit. No mention, just yet, of the Resurrection. What follows next is the procession outside, under our beautiful Entry Portico, and the scripture reading from the gospel of Saint Mark, who wrote of the women that first found the empty tomb into which the body of the Lord Jesus was placed just two days before.

They are the first to hear the Good News from the angel at the tomb who proclaims, "You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen! He is not here!" (Mark 16:6)

Dear Faithful, the message that Christ the Savior was no longer confined to the tomb, that He truly

had risen from the grave and death, is a profound and life-changing message that has continuously been spread throughout the world to this day. It has lost neither its meaning, its power, nor its significance for humankind over the centuries.

I lovingly encourage and invite all to take part in our parish celebration of Christ's Holy Resurrection, beginning with the daily Holy Week services, the Divine Liturgy on Holy Saturday morning, this year celebrating with His Eminence Archbishop Gerasimos of San Francisco, and then returning at 11pm for the Resurrection Service and Divine Liturgy, and concluding with the Vespers of

Love on Easter Sunday afternoon. The full Holy Week schedule can be seen on the Calendar page of our website: www.stharalambos.org.

There will always be time for family celebrations. But let us not lose sight of our obligation, as Orthodox Christians, to come together as a


